**Stage One Gallery, Union Street, Hawera, 28 September—25 October 2008.**

Pictured below is a small selection of artworks entered in the Mind Fields exhibition, with PACE member and exhibitor Waru Wharehoka. **Mark Bloomfield** is an Inglewood sculptor working in the media of wood, stone, aerated concrete and copper foil work using glass. Mark runs one day workshops from his home when he has sufficient numbers registered. The material students are taught to carve with is aerated concrete, which is an excellent medium for carving using only hand tools. #### Upcoming workshops and seminars in association with PACE:

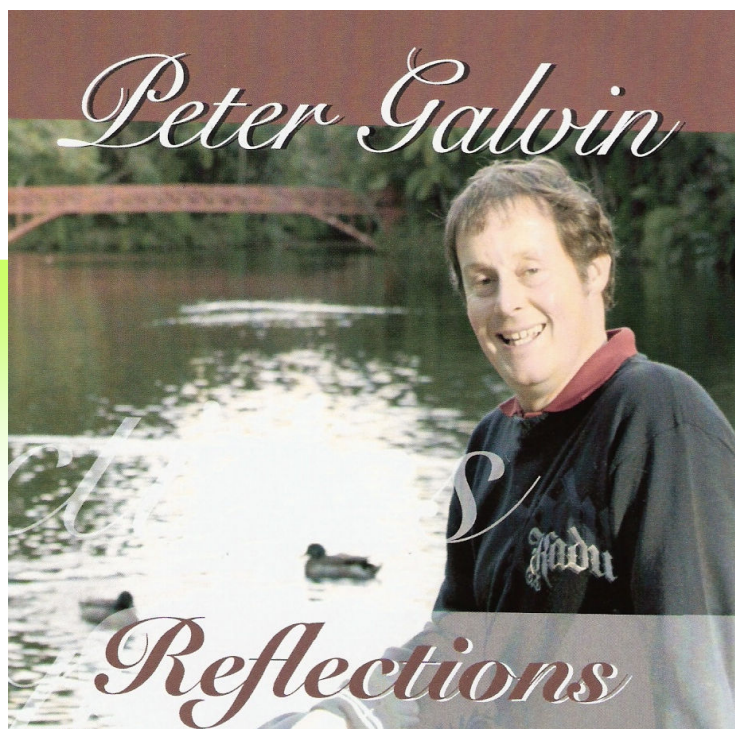
